

ASPECTS OF OUR SCHOOL POLICY AND ACTIVITIES THAT PROMOTE EDUCATION FOR GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP

Global citizenship is a very relevant topic for Loreto Convent Msongari whose vision is 'To be an exemplary school offering holistic education to the child that makes them globally competitive' our Mission is 'To progressively inculcate in our students the values propagated by Mary Ward our foundress through an effective and innovative curriculum within a dynamic society.

Loreto Convent Msongari was founded in 1921 by the Loreto sisters being their first mission in East Africa. It is located in Nairobi, The school admits students from different parts of the world. We run two systems of education concurrently, the Kenyan 8.4.4 Education system and the I.G.C.S.E British Curriculum.

This composition in itself has created room for our students to relate and think globally as they get to mingle, learn together participate in co-curricular activities and share common facilities.

Every year, Loreto Convent Msongari In conjunction with our sister school Loreto Convent Valley Road, organize an international holiday-focused trip for the students. Nevertheless it always turns out to be a great learning experience. It greatly develops in them a sense of appreciating other culture practices different from their own and prepares those of them who join universities in other countries to integrate very well in whichever part of the world.

Other than the international trips, our students participate in various activities and clubs both within and outside the school, one of which is the East African Model United Nations (EAMUN) that is a yearly event. In the EAMUN, they are grouped in Political, Economic, Ecology and Human rights committees where they represent different countries and discuss the respective issues of the country in their committees. There are also specialized committees: Global health council, Security Council, special Summit, Mendonsa Charity council and International court of justice council. In these the students debate about respective relevant issues and their possible solutions. The debate themes depends on the council they belong to. Among the skills learnt by the students in this event are: conflict resolution and management skills, Public speaking, service orientation, emotional intelligence as well as leadership skills. The EAMUN specifically has a global nature orientation and this exposure is quite helpful to our students.



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
